





Assembly Steps




This Bar Stool has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Bar Stool parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



- **1.1)** Place the Side Frame(A) flat on a clean, non-marring surface as shown.
- **1.2)** Insert Front Rail(B) and Back Rail(C) into Side Frame(A) ensuring the center holes are facing inside as shown in the picture.
- **1.3)** Insert Strechers(D) into Side Frame(A).


Step 2



Place the other Side Frame(A) on a clean, non-marring surface. Then, carefully align the Side Frames(A) together as shown in the picture.

Insert Front Rail(B), Back Rail(C) and Strechers(D) into Side Frame(A).

Step 3




Carefully stand the Bar Stool Base up.


Then, Attach using Bolts(1), Spring Washers(2) and Washers(3) with Allen Key(5).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.

Step 4



- 4.1) Place the Seat(E) facedown on a clean table, align the Bar Stool Base with the Seat(E)
- **4.2)** Insert the wood dowel on the Front Rail(B) into the holes on Seat(E) as shown above.
- **4.3)** Then, attach Seat(E) using Screws(4) with Screwdriver(6). Do not fully tighten the Screws.




Place the Bar Stool on a Level Surface to check for wobbles. If it wobbles, lift the Bar Stool some 30 to 50 cm high from the ground, keep your feet and toes well away from the drop zone, and drop the Bar Stool vertically with all four Legs, hitting the ground at the same time. The Drop Test will help to ensure that all Bolts and gaps reach full alignment.

Test again for evenness on a Level Surface.

If no wobbles are found, proceed to tighten all the Bolts.

When tightening the Bolts, tighten sequentially. Do not tighten any Bolt fully and then move on to the next one, this could cause the frame to warp. If it still wobbles, loosen the Bolts and execute this same drop test.

If the Bar Stool is not Stable it could lead to damage to the product.



Inspect and make sure all parts are fully connected Your Bar Stool is ready for use.

This Bar Stool can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Care & Maintenance

O Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface

Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.

Do not place fumiture under direct sunlight.

O Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.

Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.

What is Proposition 65?

Additionally, this warning label is very common and can be found on almost every piece of furniture sold in the state of California.
