







This Counter Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Counter Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective.

Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.



Place the Chair Back(A) and Chair Seat(B) on a clean, non-marring surface. Remove the Seat Base Cover from the underside of the Chair Seat(B) and take out all of the Parts and Hardware.



Put the Chair back(A) onto a flat table or panel.

Align the positioning dowels on the Chair Seat(B) with the mounting positions located on the Chair Back panel and Chair Seat panel.


Use your left hand to push the seat frame floorwards, depicted by Arrow 1.

This action helps to ensure the chair seat(B) is pressed towards to the chair back(A) with no gap between these.

Then, attach using the one middle hole and bolts². The four corner mounting positions will be used later.

The hardware for these is Bolts①+ Bolt②+ Flat Washers③ + Spring Washers④, using the Allen key⑤ to tighten the bolts.


At this point of the assembly, DO NOT overfasten the connections.



Place the Chair Back (A), Chair Seat(B), Left Front Leg(C), Left Front Leg(D) onto a soft surface to avoid any scratches or damage to the product.

Attach the Left Front Leg (C), and the Left Front Leg (D) to the Counter Chair Seat(B) and secure with 4 Bolts ②, 4 Spring Washers ③ and 4 Flat Washers ④ per each leg with the Allen Key⑤ as is shown the picture.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts[®] in this step.




Insert the Front Side Rail (E) into the round housing of the Left Front Leg (C) as shown above.

Caution: You may need to apply a little pressure to the Right Front leg (D) pushing outwards, so as to enable the Front Side Rail (E) to be slotted into position. If the distance is not enough, you need to go back and loosen the bolts in step 3, ensuring the foot pole has enough space to insert the rail.

Secure with 2 Wood Screws[®] per each Side rail (E,F,G).

Tighten Screws[®] using a Screwdriver[®] (not provided).


This Drop Test will help to ensure that all the bolts and gaps reach full alignment.

Test again for evenness on a Level Surface.

If no wobbles are found, proceed to tighten all the Bolts.

Caution: When tightening the Bolts, tighten sequentially.

Do not tighten any screw fully and then move towards the next one, this would cause the frame to warp. If it still wobbles, loosen the bolts and execute this same drop test. If the Counter Chair is not Stable it could lead to damage of the product.



Place the Seat Base Cover back as shown in the picture. Smooth the MagicTape down with your hand on all four sides at the edge of the seat.

Inspect and make sure all parts are connected.

The Counter Chair is ready for use.

Caution: This Counter Chair can only be used on a flat, level surface.
